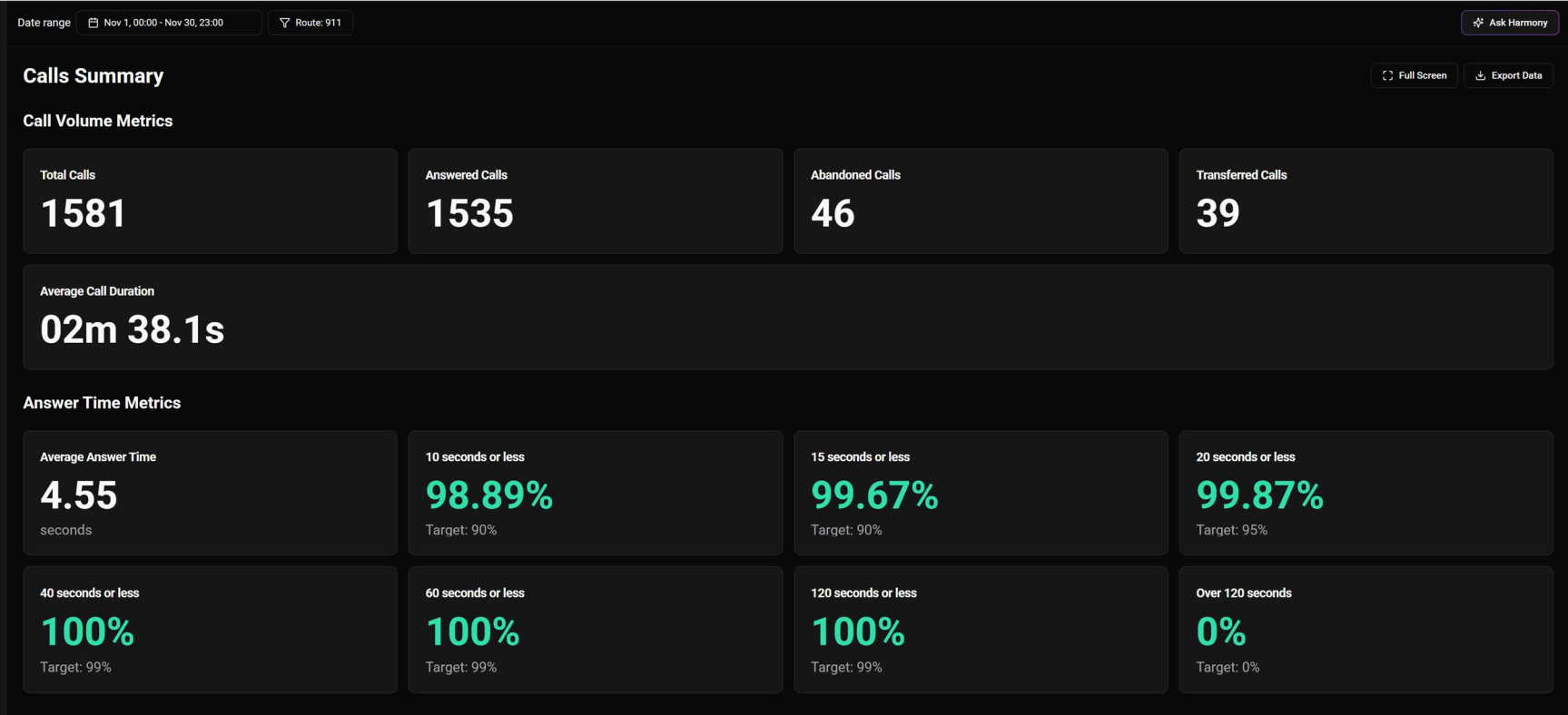

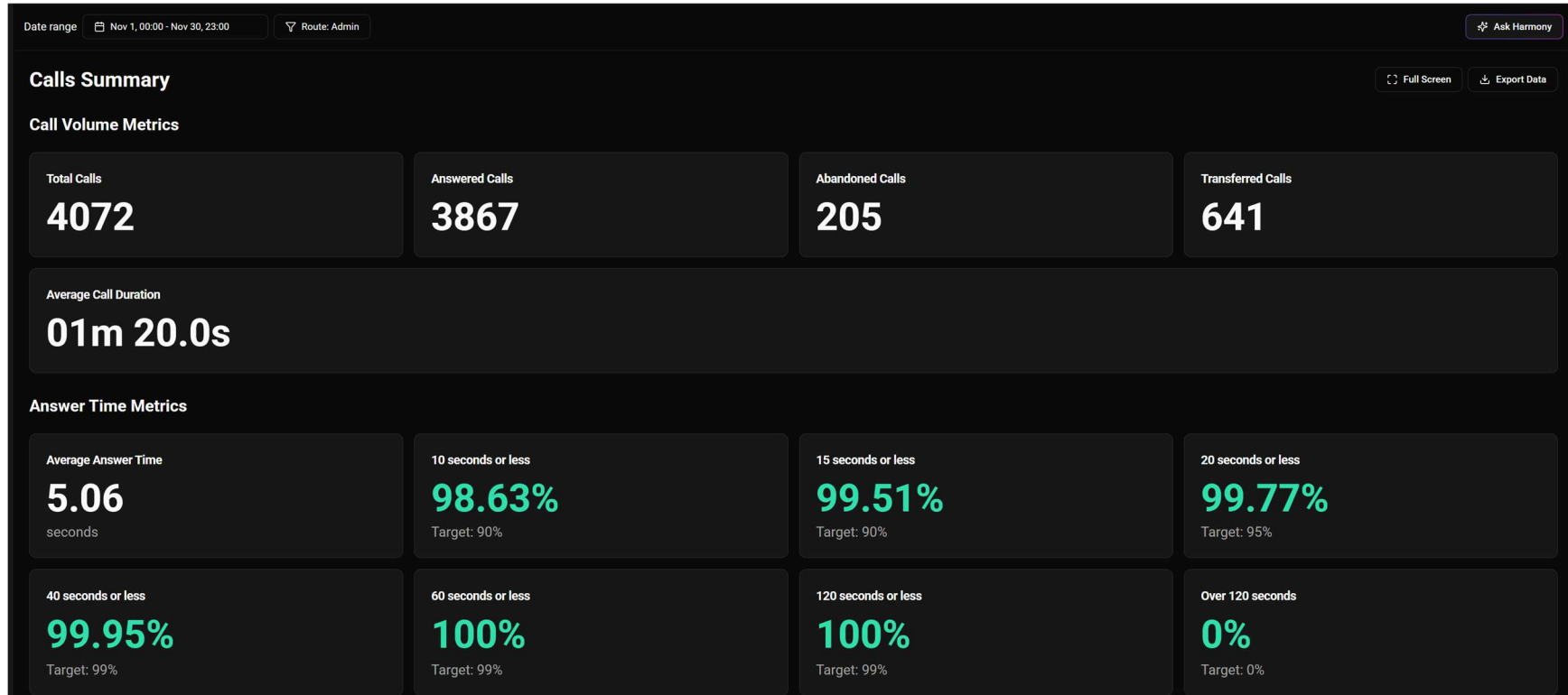

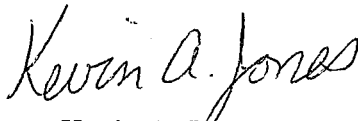
Re: Public Defender Office Update
