**Authorize Agreement with Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc. d/b/a SCRAM Systems for Electronic
Monitoring - Probation Department**

WHEREAS, Cortland County Probation seeks to enter into an agreement with Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc., d/b/a SCRAM Systems, for the provision of electronic monitoring equipment, software, and related services for probation clients; AND

WHEREAS, the proposed agreement includes services and equipment for passive electronic home confinement, GPS monitoring, remote alcohol monitoring, and related monitoring support services for Alternatives to Incarceration clients; AND

WHEREAS, the agreement also includes related PharmChek Drug Patch products and services, as needed, for drug testing and monitoring purposes; AND

WHEREAS, the initial term of the agreement is thirty-six (36) months commencing upon execution of the agreement; AND

WHEREAS, the cost of services and equipment will vary based upon usage, equipment type, monitoring services, and applicable pricing schedules set forth in the agreement; AND

WHEREAS, said services will be paid from Alternatives to Incarceration grant funds from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, through funding account A.314043.43310; AND

WHEREAS, the equipment and services are offered at state contract/NASPO pricing rates; NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Cortland County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Administrator, upon review and approval of the County Attorney or designee and subject to appropriation by the Cortland County Legislature, to enter into a thirty-six (36) month agreement with Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc., d/b/a SCRAM Systems, for electronic home confinement, GPS monitoring, remote alcohol monitoring, PharmChek Drug Patch products, and related services; AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, that expenditures under this agreement shall be made from account A.314043.43310, subject to the availability of appropriated funds and applicable grant funding; AND BE IT FURTHER

AN ACT to amend the tax law and the real property tax law, in relation to tax credits for volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subsection (e-1) of section 606 of the tax law, as added by
2 section 1 of part U of chapter 62 of the laws of 2006, paragraph 2 as
3 amended by chapter 532 of the laws of 2007, paragraph 3 as added and
4 paragraph 4 as renumbered by section 4 of part N of chapter 61 of the
5 laws of 2006, is amended to read as follows:
6 (e-1) Volunteer firefighters' and ambulance workers' credit. (1) For
7 taxable years beginning on and after January first, two thousand seven
8 and before January first, two thousand twenty-six, a resident taxpayer
9 who serves as an active volunteer firefighter as defined in subdivision
10 one of section two hundred fifteen of the general municipal law or as a
11 volunteer ambulance worker as defined in subdivision fourteen of section
12 two hundred nineteen-k of the general municipal law shall be allowed a
13 credit against the tax imposed by this article equal to two hundred
14 dollars. For taxable years beginning on and after January first, two
15 thousand twenty-six, a resident taxpayer who serves as an active volun-
16 teer firefighter as defined in subdivision one of section two hundred
17 fifteen of the general municipal law or as a volunteer ambulance worker
18 as defined in subdivision fourteen of section two hundred nineteen-k of
19 the general municipal law shall be allowed a credit against the tax

2 receive this credit a volunteer firefighter or volunteer ambulance work-

6 sand twenty-six, if a taxpayer receives a real property tax exemption
7 relating to such service under title two of article four of the real
8 property tax law, such taxpayer shall not be eligible for this credit;
9 provided, however (A) if the taxpayer receives such real property tax
10 exemption in the two thousand seven taxable year as a result of making
11 application therefor in a prior year or (B) if the taxpayer notifies
12 [~~his or her~~] such taxpayer's assessor in writing by December thirty-
13 first, two thousand seven of the taxpayer's intent to discontinue such

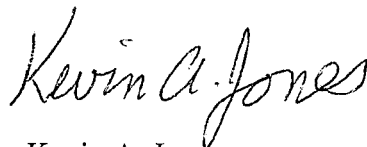
Re: Public Defender Office Update

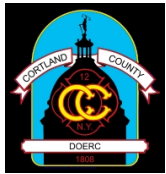
