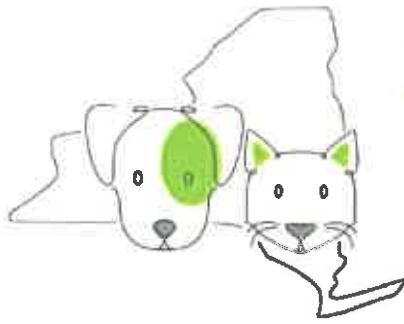

SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT MONTHLY REPORT - AUGUST

AGRICULTURE AND PRIVATE LAND CONSERVATION

Agricultural Environmental Management (AEM) –The 2022-2023 AEM Base contract close-out documentation is complete. Planning assistance continues with some new landowners/ag producers and we continue to evaluate projects for submission to the CAFO-ENMP grant program. Staff will have a display and be presenting at an Organic Valley and Alliance for the Chesapeake Regional Farmer meeting on August 6th here in Cortland.

Agricultural Nonpoint Abatement and Control Program (AGNP) –We continue engineering design work for grants funded in Round 28 and 29. One of the Round 28 projects is under construction and staff are on-site regularly to monitor progress and perform engineering construction checks and oversight.

Climate Resilient Farming – One of the Round 6 projects is under construction and expected to finish next week. This is a stream corridor stabilization project in Lapeer. Project designs for other work funded in Rounds 6 and 7 are in process.

Nutrient Management Planning and Documentation efforts continue. A meeting was held with five local farms from one area of the county to discuss basic nutrient management principles and collect farm data. Many pasture and grass-based farms have surplus land base so manure and fertilizer applications seldom meet or exceed nutrient management recommendations and standards. Many farms are also keeping records of manure and fertilizer applications for other programs or purposes. These farms would then be meeting nutrient management standards which could be credited in water quality models. We are working to identify and meet with these farmers throughout the county to document their good stewardship.

USDA Local Working Group – SWCD will hold and chair this meeting on August 6th at 1 pm. USDA programs and priorities will be discussed.

COMMUNITY NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT AND PLANNING

Little York Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District (LYLPRD) – Harvesting was completed on the lake for a full week in early June. Vegetation growth and species are being evaluated for additional harvesting needs this month.

AIS Spread Prevention – We have boat stewards staffed regularly at Skaneateles Lake, Tully Lake and Little York Lake this summer. We continue outreach efforts and will be attending the Melody Lake picnic, the Bluegrass Festival, and Tully swim lessons early this month. Numerous other events are on the calendar. Please contact us if you are aware of a community event that we could attend and table with a display and informational materials and handouts on aquatic invasive species.

Buffer Stewarding- staff continue to assess and maintain the nearly 150 acres of previously planted buffers at over 50 sites in the county. This effort will help to ensure the successful establishment of these important bmps.

We also recently hosted the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation on a tour to the Augur stream corridor enhancement project in Solon. This project includes nearly 8 acres of buffer plantings. Livestock were also fenced away from the stream and an alternative water supply was constructed for the farm. In addition to the buffer and fencing, the stream was stabilized with rock riprap on the banks to prevent erosion, and several rock barbs to maintain the flow of the stream in the center of the channel. NFWF personnel were very impressed by the project.

Skaneateles Lake Watershed and Skaneateles Lake 9E Plan – The Technical Advisory Committee has completed most of their work for the 9E Plan and focus has switched to implementation efforts. We have identified two sites for riparian forested buffers in the watershed and are working to finalize plans for spring planting. Work is expected to begin this fall on the Grout Brook stream assessment project. Staff will be walking the brook and major tributaries to identify potential project sites, including stream stabilization, floodplain reconnection and buffers.

Stream Restoration and Culvert Rehabilitation – The two final projects planned for 2024 construction in Virgil Creek watershed are underway. The lower Holler Road project is nearly complete and we are beginning the Upper Holler Rd site. We continue to work on a permit and culvert sizing for a replacement project in Freetown. We have been given verbal consent for one last extension on the Skaneateles WQIP grant so that the Grout Brook culvert replacement with County Highway at Grinnell Rd can be completed. We will work to obtain the extension and also secure new quotes for the concrete box culvert with delivery and installation in summer 2025. The county highway will begin the Brackel Creek project next week. This is an ARPA project.

Staff are finishing culvert condition assessments in the Upper Tioughnioga watershed and this fall will begin assessment work in the Owego Creek watershed. This project will include stream assessment and the NAACC aquatic organism passage assessment and scoring.

Forestry –We have ordered more large potted stock for planting at Dwyer Park this fall. Additional inventory has also been ordered and we are finalizing planting locations. This will probably be the last year we can offer the larger stock, or at least until a new grant or funding source can be secured.

Septic Maintenance workshops were held July 23rd in Preble and July 25th in Scott at the Glen Haven Historical Society. Over 30 people attended and another 24 certificates were issued. We are currently working with a consultant engineer to support more substantial repair and maintenance efforts on several other properties. By repairing and upgrading septic systems we can reduce the impact that failing or poorly functioning systems pose to our water quality. If you know anyone with a septic system that they think is failing or not functioning properly, please have them contact us ASAP. Work must be completed this year.

CONSERVATION EDUCATION AND PROGRAMS

The Conservation Field Days will be held September 19 and 20, 2024. Coordination is underway.

The 2024 River Cleanup will be held September 28th. Groups can register to clean up their favorite waterbody or waterway. We will provide collection materials to registered groups and dispose of trash collected.

ADMINISTRATION

We continue to work our way through contract paperwork for several projects in the Statewide Financial System (SFS). We have prepared a Data Breach policy for the SWCD. Budget preparation is underway.

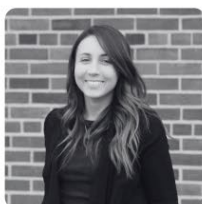
